

SPECIAL FILMING CONDITIONS WESTWOOD VILLAGE IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION AREA

The Special Filming Conditions described below will be included in the terms and conditions of permits issued for filming in this area and are in addition to the standard terms and conditions applicable to filming permits generally. While these Special Filming Conditions will be included as terms if a permit for filming in this area is issued, they are not intended to, and do not, establish the criteria or standards for determining whether or not a particular permit (or permits) will be issued for this area. The decision whether or not a particular permit (or permits) will be issued is vested in the discretion of the appropriate City or County department or their designees (including FilmL.A., Inc.), to be exercised consistent with public health, safety and general welfare, and applicable land-use ordinances.

The following Special Filming Conditions for location filming in the Westwood Village Business Improvement Association (WVIA) have been established so that both local businesses and production companies filming in the area can operate successfully and function in a cooperative manner. These Special Conditions apply to the area in Westwood approximately bordered by Gayley Avenue, Le Conte Avenue, Hilgard Avenue and Wilshire Boulevard during regular business hours. Regular business hours are defined as 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

- **Affected residents/merchants/businesses within 500 feet of any filming activity, including equipment parking, must be notified at least two (2) days in advance of the first day of filming or the first day of any substantial set preparation.** *Permit requests must be submitted at least three (3) days in advance.*
- **Production companies must contact the Westwood Village Improvement Association (WVIA), Megan Furey (310) 470-1812 at least two (2) working days in advance of the first day of filming or substantial prep.**
- **Cast/crew parking is not permitted on area streets or in the public parking structure on Broxton Avenue.** Access to the public structure on Broxton Avenue must remain open at all times. Signage may be required when closing street. Off-street, alternate parking must be provided.
- **Catering and feeding of cast/crew members shall be done on private property and may not impact area businesses.** Food should not be given directly to the homeless persons in the area. Production companies wishing to help the homeless should do so through one of the service providers in the area. Production companies are required to completely remove all trash, food, cardboard boxes, etc. from the general vicinity at the end of each filming day. Production companies will be held responsible for all cleanups.
- **Posting of "No Parking" signs (for parking equipment vehicles or for picture) should be kept to a minimum in order to reduce any negative impact on the local business community.** Companies may post or park in front of businesses that indicate approval upon FilmL.A.'s survey form, or businesses that are clearly vacant or closed during the hours of activity. Broxton Avenue has very little metered parking. Surveys may be required from both sides of street depending on the impact to the businesses (requests will be evaluated on a case by case basis).
- **CalTrans/LADOT approved notification signs will be required for all filming activity that requires a full closure of Broxton Ave, or any other full street closure. They must be in place in advance of filming activity and must include the dates and times of closures.**
- **Unless approved by the Permit Authority, filming activities that involve exteriors, the use of sidewalks, streets or parking facilities shall be prohibited on all national holidays.** The Permit Authority approval will be based on a Filming Survey of affected businesses demonstrating substantial support for the filming activities.
- **Filming activities that involve exteriors, the use of sidewalks, streets, or parking facilities will not be permitted for the two weeks preceding Christmas Day.**
- **A FilmL.A. Monitor will be assigned to encourage compliance with the permit and conditions.** The Monitor will generally arrive at the designated location 1 hour prior to the permit start time to note proper arrival time and remain with the production company during all filming-related activities and ensure proper departure time.
