



2020 COVID-19 Production Limits Timeline

This timeline reflects FilmLA's total knowledge of COVID-19 related filming limits enacted from 3/12/20 through 3/20/20. FilmLA serves 16 different city & county clients and seven school districts. Only closures and limits reported to FilmLA by these clients are recorded below. Any additional closures and limits enacted by these jurisdictions but not reported to FilmLA are not included.

Prior to 3/12/20

Filming continues to be allowed in all areas of the City and County of Los Angeles as usual.

Effective 3/12/20

City of Los Angeles

- Los Angeles City Hall closed.
- City of LA buildings, facilities, parks open only to productions with cast & crew < 50 people.
- Filming in City of LA right-of-way open only to productions with cast & crew < 250 people.
- No restrictions in City of LA on filming at private residences and businesses.

City of Santa Monica

- City enacts limits on posted parking for filming.

LA Community College District

- LA City College closed campus to filming and scouting.

Los Angeles Unified School District

- District closes all facilities to filming and basecamps.

Effective 3/13/20

County of Los Angeles

- County buildings, facilities, parks open only to production with cast & crew < 50 people.

City of Los Angeles

- City of LA libraries closed to filming.

City of Gardena

- City enacts hold on all film permits.

Norwalk / La Mirada School District

- District closes all facilities to filming & basecamps.

Effective 3/16/20

County of Los Angeles

- All indoor County-owned facilities closed to filming.
- Filming in public right of way and flood control districts restricted to < 50 cast & crew.

City of Santa Monica

- City enacts hold on all film permits.

LA Community College District

- LA Valley College closes campus to filming and scouting.

Effective 3/19/20

County of Los Angeles

- Suspends all on-location filming at midnight, without exception.

City of Los Angeles

- Suspends all on-location filming at midnight, without exception.
